PAHAYAG National Tracker: April is an independent and non-commissioned survey conducted by PUBLICUS between **April 19-21, 2022**.

It is a nationwide purposive sampling survey comprised of 1,500 respondents randomly drawn by the Singapore office of US-based firm **PureSpectrum** from its market research panel of over 200,000 Filipinos.

The final survey panel was restricted to registered voters. Parameters based on respondent age, gender, and location were also utilized in the sample formulation in order for the resulting sample to conform more closely to the features of the voting population, as defined by statistics from the COMELEC.

The nationwide margin of error is +/- 3%. The margin of error in NCR is ~7%, and 6% in other regional groupings.

FERDINAND “BONGBONG” MARCOS JR. (BBM) registered a 1% increase from early April to late April. While this increase in itself is not statistically significant, it is worth noting that his 57% preference share is his highest mark since the start of the 2022 election cycle PUBLICUS surveys. **MA. LEONOR “LENI” ROBREDO** slid back down to her March reading of 21%. **FRANCISCO “ISKO MORENO” DOMAGOSO (ISKO)** recorded a significant 3% drop in the latest survey – dropping from 9% to 6% within two weeks’ time.

BBM holds massive leads over LENI in NCL, VIS, and MIN. He leads LENI in SL, albeit with a narrower margin. The two are statistically tied in NCR given the in-group margin of error.

BBM leads LENI in all ECONOMIC CLASSES. His leads are especially large in CLASSES D AND E. LENI exceeds the 20% only in CLASS CLUSTER ABC. ISKO appears to have lost tremendous support in CLASS E where he is now only at 2%.

Around 90% of BBM supporters can be viewed to be FIRM VOTERS. A slightly lower share (84%) of LENI supporters were found to be FIRM VOTERS. It is of note that roughly a third of ISKO supporters (~2% of the overall sample) can still be swayed to vote for another candidate in the remaining weeks. A similar share of NON-FIRM VOTERS was found for PANFILO “PING” LACSON.

If LENI withdraws, her supporters would be more or less split across DE GUZMAN, DOMAGOSO, and LACSON. If ISKO withdraws, the bulk of his supporters will switch to PING, while some of the remainder will be split between LENI and BBM.

“INDAY SARA” DUTERTE-CARPIO (SARA) is presently polling at 59% . This represents her highest preference share across all PAHAYAG survey rounds for the 2022 election cycle. This is a significant increase from her longer-term average of roughly 56%.

The other candidates did not register any significant changes over the past two weeks. Nevertheless, given the slight decline in the numbers of “DOC WILLIE” ONG, there are now only two candidates who are statistically tied for 2nd place – FRANCIS “KIKO” PANGILINAN and VICENTE “TITO” SOTTO III.

SARA holds massive leads over the rest of the field in NCL, VIS, and MIN. SARA holds a sizeable but relatively narrower lead over KIKO in SL. SARA and KIKO can be viewed to be statistically tied in NCR largely due to the group sample size.

SARA is immensely popular across all ECONOMIC CLASSES. Similar to BBM, she is especially popular in CLASSES D and E.

The vast majority of SARA supporters (93%) are FIRM VOTERS. The three lagging candidates have comparable levels of firm voters, with KIKO holding a slight edge over the other two second place candidates.

If KIKO withdraws, around 44% will be split between ONG and SOTTO. If SOTTO withdraws, KIKO gains a quarter of SOTTO supporters – but SARA gains 30% of SOTTO supporters. IF ONG withdraws, the bulk of his votes will be split across SARA, SOTTO, and KIKO. The withdrawal of one or two of the lagging candidates would thus not alter the current calculus of voter preference.

ESCUDERO, CAYETANO, and GATCHALIAN remain in the first tier with preference shares above the 40% mark – despite noticeable decreases in their survey-to-survey numbers.

LEGARDA slipped from the first to the second tier with her current 39.1% preference share but still placed 4th overall. PADILLA (ROBIN) exceeded the 30% mark with a 5.8 point gain, reaching the second tier for the first time.

Other notable movements include BAUTISTA’s 5% increase.

The movements during this survey round appear to be making competition more fierce in the Competitive Zone (Average: 24.9%). There are now 13 candidates (9th to 21st places) who appear to be within striking distance of the final four Senate seats.
